2. What is it going to cost me? Payable with your application:

- R150 as non-refundable application fee when submitting your application admission.
- R500 as refundable residence deposit if you do not receive a place in a residence.
- One payment of R650 may be made to the NWU

4. Requirements for campus residence placements and criteria

Applicants MUST apply for residence placement in a campus residence before or on 30 June 2017. Selection takes place in July. All placements are done on the basis of merit and availability of place in a residence. Selection mark: 70% academics and 30% participation in culture, sport and/or leadership.
