After initially working for John Maddox at Nature in London and Washington, Dr Baker edited the SA Journal of Science for over three decades. He was General Editor for the SA Institute of Mining and Metallurgy Monograph Series, and a founding member of the editorial board and chair of the management committee of the SA science magazine, Quest: Science for South Africa. He has served as consultant, reviewer, and guest editor to a variety of professional scientific and technical bodies, continues to provide high-end editorial services to researchers publishing in and across disciplines in the natural and social sciences, and conducts regular university-based workshops on planning and writing research articles for publication.

His consulting work is based on his years as editor and publisher of an accredited international multidisciplinary research journal, and ongoing experience of working with researchers and reviewers globally across a wide range of academic disciplines.

Dr Lickindorf taught for 21 years in South African universities, was appointed professor and head of the Department of English at the University of Port Elizabeth, became the founding editor for its first four years of the popular science magazine, Quest: Science for South Africa, conducted courses in professional communication at the Wits for 12 years, and continues to provide ongoing technical editorial services to researchers and professionals in SA and elsewhere, including those involved in higher education policy. From 1999 until the present, she has been designing and conducting article writing workshops and retreats for individual universities and institutes.

Their association with NWU goes back many years, conducting research-writing workshops and retreats and giving editorial assistance to all levels of NWU researchers as well as designed and conducted developmental and other article-writing interventions for the University.
