Dear family members, colleagues, students, and friends

Today, we are coming together in remembrance of all our colleagues and students who have lost their lives during the 2022 academic year. It is with great sadness that I acknowledge the North-West University community has lost 10 staff members and 16 students during this year. My sincere and deepest condolences to the bereaved families, colleagues, friends, and classmates. May God continue to bless you with the strength to deal with the grief, and may HE make all your wishes come true.

As part of the university's values and ethic of care, the University Management Committee resolved to commence with the practice of hosting memorial services on each of our campuses for staff and students who passed away during the academic year. This is envisaged to be an annual ceremony – starting this year – to remember members of our NWU community who have lost their lives.

Losing a loved one is very painful, and we all deal with these losses in a different way. However, one thing that can be certain is that we carry the memories of those we have lost in our hearts. We remember and celebrate their lives – the role they played in enriching our lives, and the difference they have made in our various spheres of life – our boardrooms, student centres, classrooms, sports grounds, and others.
